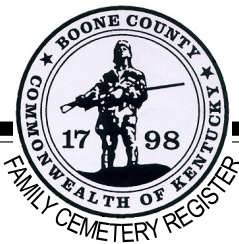


E. Aylor Cemetery

COMMENTS:

The Aylor family was a part of the Germanna colony in Virginia. Members of the family migrated to Boone County, Kentucky in c. 1810. The wife of Rev. William Carpenter, first pastor of Hopeful Lutheran Church, was Polly Aylor.

Ephraim Aylor married again in 1857 to Elizabeth Crisler. They had two sons, Owen and John, both buried at Hopeful Lutheran Cemetery.

January 11, 2001: At one time, there was some confusion regarding the relationship between this cemetery and the Stanton Aylor Cemetery. The Stanton Aylor Cemetery is located on US 42 just south of 8739 US 42 and was never associated with the E. Aylor Cemetery.
